Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a wonderful summer. Mrs Blake and I are delighted to see the children back in school. Our first week: 'The Expedition' is focused around welcoming the children back into school life. We will be looking forward to the journey of the academic year ahead with a real focus on wellbeing, our hopes and dreams and how to be successful in our journey and . This is will involve a variety of lessons and practical activities to encourage team building, mindfulness strategies and problem solving skills.

In **English**, we will be using a text called 'Angel of Grasmere' by Tom Palmer. The story is set during the war, and talks about how the village of Grasmere pull together as a community. This text will be used to support the children to write a diary entry and a setting description, as well as building up to writing a narrative. We will recap some Year 4 grammar objectives, before learning new Year 5 grammar features.

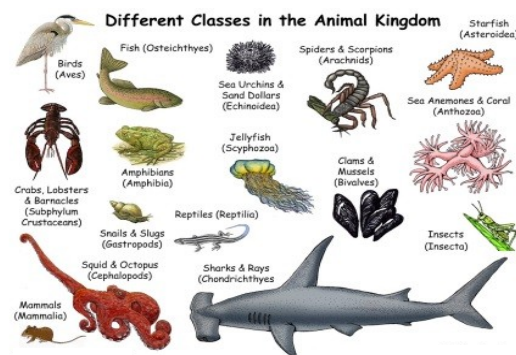
Our **Maths** work will start with a really important unit on place value where children will use, write, compare and solve problems with numbers up to one million. We will be looking at roman numerals too. After this, we will be recapping our work on column addition and subtraction. Children are expected to know all times tables to 12x12 by the end of Year 4, so it is vital that any gaps in this are filled as quickly as possible to enable children to access the types of calculations and problem solving that forms the Year 5 curriculum.



'How environmentally friendly is East Morton?' will be our **Geography** question this term. We will explore issues around renewable energy and sustainability and find out how we can help the environment through initiatives such as recycling. As a class we will carry out of field study in the local community to consider how environmentally friendly the village is.

This half term in **Science** we will begin with a biology unit called 'How do plants and animals reproduce?' Here we will investigate living things, look at how they are classified and identify differences and similarities between them. We will also find out about the work of naturalists and animal behaviourists such as David Attenborough and Jane Goodall.

Our **RE** topic this half term will be 'What does it mean for Muslims to follow God?' The children will find explore Islam, reflecting on the beliefs of Muslims and how this impacts how they live their lives. We will be going on a visit to a local mosque to speak with a Muslim faith leader there as a part of our ongoing leaning about faith. The letter for this was sent earlier this week.
